• Open educational resources (OER)

"teaching and learning resources in any medium, digital or otherwise, that permit no-cost access, use, reuse and repurposing by others with no or limited restrictions." (UNESCO, 2019, para 1.)

• Open educational practices (OEP)

"Teaching and learning practices where openness is enacted within all aspects of instructional practice; including the design of learning outcomes, the selection of teaching resources, and the planning of activities and assessment. OEP engage both faculty and students with the use and creation of open educational resources, ... and support participatory student-directed projects." (Paskevicius, 2017, p.127)

Terms

• Open Education

"...open education is not limited to just open educational resources. It also draws upon open technologies that facilitate collaborative, flexible learning and the open sharing of teaching practices that empower educators to benefit from the best ideas of their colleagues" (UNESCO Capetown Declaration, 2018).

• Open Educator

"An open educator chooses to use open approaches, when possible and appropriate, with the aim to remove all unnecessary barriers to learning" (Nascimbeni & Burgos, 2016)
