The following are updates to *Canadian Gambling Digest 2007-08*:

Page 2: Table 1 (Venues)

Prince Edward Island: Number of *Bingo Facilities* was one (not zero). *Total Venues 2007-08* was 261 (not 260).

Canada: *Total Venues 2007-08* was 37,783 (not 37,782).

Page 3: Footnote 5

In Alberta, there were approximately 500 slot machines at summer fair casinos and other temporary exhibitions (not 1,267). Figures in previous *Digests* should similarly have been reported as approximately 500.

Page 6: Table 5 (Total Government-operated Gaming Revenue)

British Columbia: The figures for *Internet* and *Non-Internet* ticket lottery revenues should be reversed (i.e., Internet revenue was \$8,400,000; Non-Internet revenue was \$425,700,000).

Prince Edward Island: *Total Revenue 2007-08* was \$41,228,000 (not \$40,501,000; the previous figure did not include \$727,000 in table game revenue from Charlottetown Driving Park and Entertainment Centre.) *Total Revenue 2006-07* was \$39,989,950 (not \$39,961,950; the previous figure did not include \$28,000 in table game revenue from Charlottetown Driving Park and Entertainment Centre.)

Canada: *Total Revenue 2007-08* was \$13,754,988,000 (not \$13,754,261,000). *Total Revenue 2006-07* was \$13,342,917,855 (not \$13,342,889,855).

Page 7: Chart 1 (Total Government-operated Gaming Revenue per Person 18+)

Prince Edward Island: *Total Government-operated Gaming Revenue per Person 18+* in 2007-08 was \$378 (not \$372).

Canada: *Average Government-operated Gaming Revenue per Person 18+* in 2007-08 was \$548 (not \$547).

Page 8: **Chart 2** (Percentage of Total Government-operated Gaming Revenue Derived from Bingo, Casinos, Non-casino EGMs, and Ticket Lotteries)

Prince Edward Island: The percentage of revenue from *Non-casino EGMs* and *Ticket Lotteries* was 65% and 33%, respectively (not 66% and 34%). The figures do not add up to 100 because they exclude table game revenue from Charlottetown Driving Park and Entertainment Centre.

Page 11: **Table 8** (Net Gaming Revenue to Government)

New Brunswick: *Total Horse Racing (Tax) Revenue* to government was \$57,000. (Although \$635,000 was collected by the Province, only \$57,000 was retained by government; the remainder was directed to the horse racing industry.) *Total Revenue 2007-08* was \$128,290,000 (not \$128,868,000).

Canada: *Total Revenue 2007-08* was \$7,000,642,000 (not \$7,001,220,000).

Total Revenue 2007-08 in Prince Edward Island also excludes table game revenue from Charlottetown Driving Park and Entertainment Centre.

Page 12: **Chart 4** (Percentage of Provincial Revenue Derived from Gaming)

New Brunswick: The *Percentage of Provincial Revenue Derived from Gaming* was 1.8% (not 1.9%).

Page 14: **Table 10** (Distributions to Charity, Problem Gambling, and Responsible Gaming)

Saskatchewan: *Total Charity 2007-08* was \$63,506,000 (not \$65,139,000). *Total Problem Gambling 2007-08* was \$4,600,000 (not \$4,000,000).

Manitoba: *Total Responsible Gaming 2007-08* was \$495,000 (not \$340,000).

Canada: *Total Charity 2007-08* was \$370,770,000 (not \$372,403,000). *Total Problem Gambling 2007-08* was \$79,745,000 (not \$77,505,000). *Total Responsible Gaming 2007-08* was \$23,468,000 (not \$23,313,000).

The FSIN distribution was \$2,100,000 (not the estimated \$1,500,000).

Page 15: Chart 5 (Percentage of Government Gaming Revenue Distributed to Problem Gambling)

Saskatchewan: The *Percentage of Government Gaming Revenue Distributed to Problem Gambling* was 1.6% (not 1.4%).

Canada: The average *Percentage of Government Gaming Revenue Distributed to Problem Gambling* was 1.5% (not 1.4%).

Chart 6 (Amount of Government Gaming Revenue Distributed to Problem Gambling per Person 18+)

Saskatchewan: The *Amount of Government Gaming Revenue Distributed to Problem Gambling per Person 18+* was \$6.04 (not \$5.26).

Canada: The average *Amount of Government Gaming Revenue Distributed to Problem Gambling per Person 18+* was \$3.65 (not \$3.53).

Page 16: Table 11 (Distributions to Federal and Municipal Governments)

Saskatchewan: *Total Federal 2007-08* was \$1,795,900 (not \$1,849,000).

Canada: *Total Federal 2007-08* was \$63,543,000 (not \$63,597,000).

Page 17: Table 12 (Gambling Participation: Provincial Surveys)

Québec: *Size of Sample* was 8,828 (not 8,842).

Page 19: Table 14 (Problem Gambling Prevalence: Provincial Surveys)

Québec: *Size of Sample* was 8,828 (not 8,842).

Page 20: Table 16 (Helpline Calls, Clients, Counsellors)

British Columbia: *Total Clients 2007-08* was 1,054 (not 1,843). *Total Counsellors 2007-08* was 36 (not 45).

Canada: *Total Clients 2007-08* was 16,582 (not 16,989). *Total Counsellors 2007-08* was 349 (not 358).

Page 21: Table 17 (On-site Support Centres)

Manitoba: *Total Responsible Gambling Visitors* was 6,400 (not 5,285).

Ontario: *Total FTE Staff* was 14.5 (not 14).

Québec: *Total Centres* was 4 (not 2).

Canada: *Total Centres* was 27 (not 25). *Total Responsible Gambling Visitors* was 65,561 (not 64,446).
