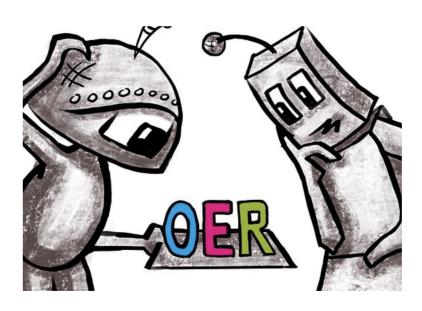

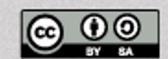

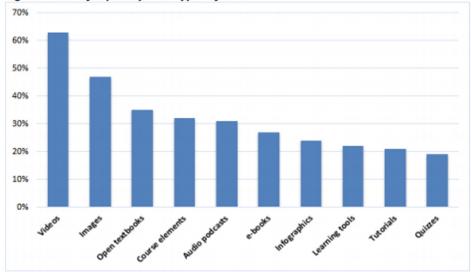

Open Educational Resources (OER) are teaching, learning and research materials in any medium – digital or otherwise – that reside in the public domain or have been released under an open license that permits no-cost access, use, adaptation and redistribution by others with no or limited restrictions. - UNESCO

What Makes an Educational Resource "Open"?



Free Open Remix Revise Reuse Retain Redistribute No Cost No Cost

Retain: The right to make, own, and control copies of the

content

Reuse: The right to use the content in a wide range of

ways

Revise: The right to adapt, adjust, modify, or alter the

content itself

Remix: The right to combine the original or revised

content with other material to create something

new

Redistribute: The right to share copies of the original content,

your revisions, or your remixes with others

How to Use OER in Your Teaching



Adopting

Adoption without alteration of a freely accessible text or resource in your course. May also include curating varied media to support learning.

Adapting

Alteration, remixing, or other adaptation of open texts or resources to add context or improve for local use, including applying an open license.

Creating

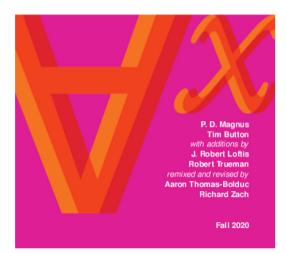
Creating teaching materials and applying an open license and/or uploading it to an open repository or website.

OER-Enabled or Open Pedagogy

Engaging students as co-producers in a course through the collaborative development, adaptation, or use of open educational resources.

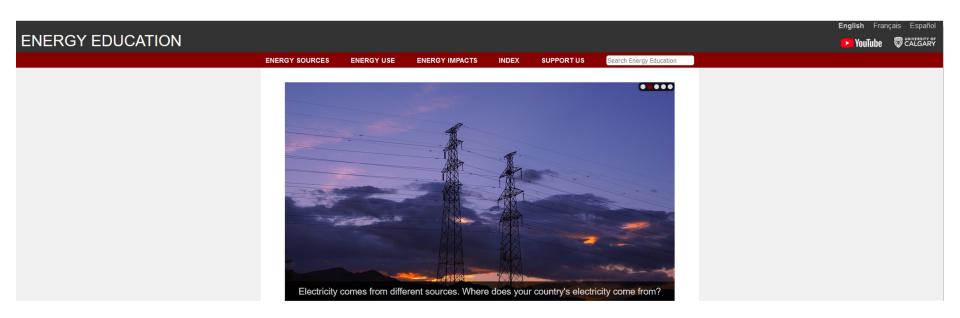

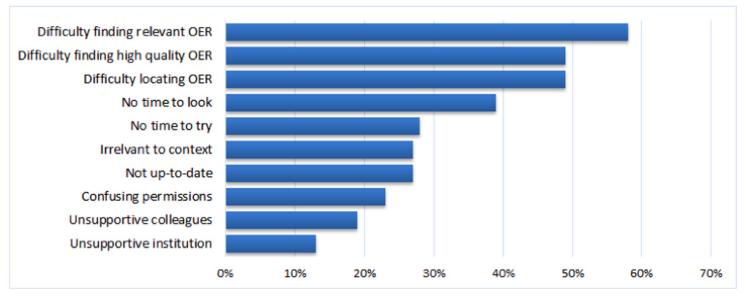

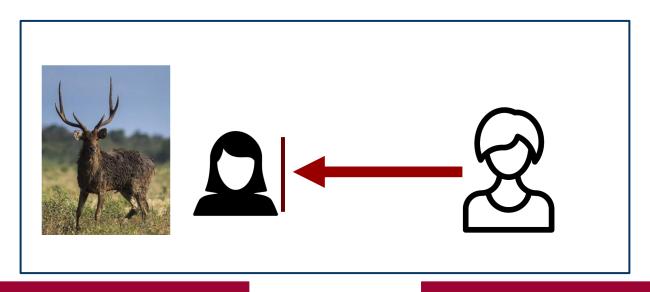

Openness, Licensing, Permission





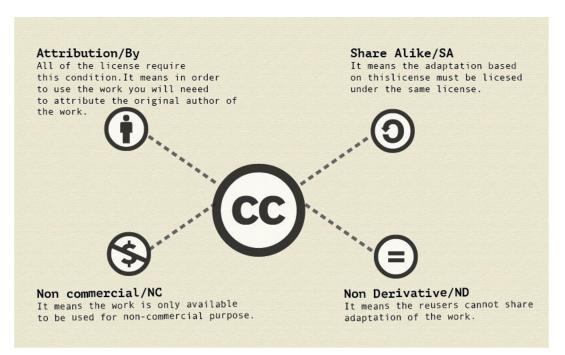

If an instructor wants to use Rie's photo for their open presentation/textbook, they will need to get **permission** from Rie.

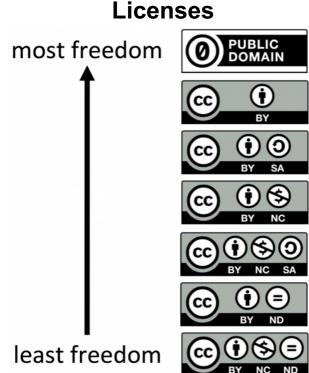

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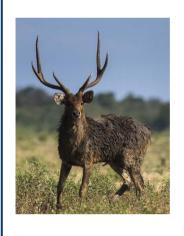




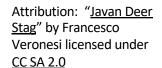

Considerations for Finding OER



1. How do you plan on using the resource?

- Will you be adopting, adapting, or creating an OER?
- Do you need an item in a particular format or on a particular platform?
- What license will be compatible with how you want to use the material?

2. What are your learning/ teaching objectives?

- Are you looking for a particular type of learning object (textbook, video, image, podcast, simulation, etc.)?
- Do you want resources to be peerreviewed?
- Do you want subject-specific or interdisciplinary material?
- What accessibility needs do your students have?

OER Search Strategies



Start broad & refine keywords

Use filters when possible

Add "OER" to your Google search

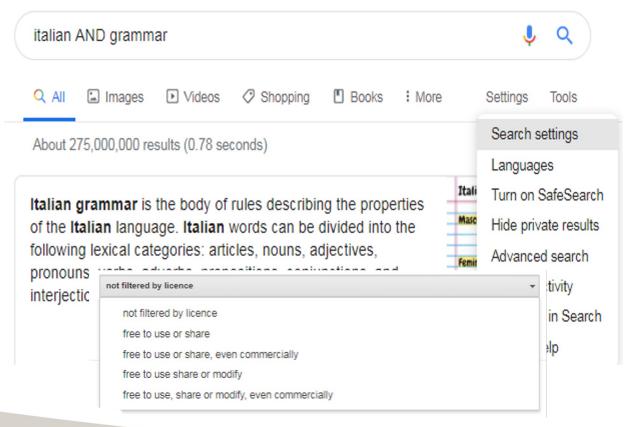
Compile a search results document

Keep your search current

Keep an open mind

Search for:

- **★** Open Textbooks
- **★** Journal Articles
- **★** Problem Banks
- **★** Images
- **★** Data
- ★ Courses

Search larger repositories and filter by subject/discipline

Guides with discipline specific places to look:

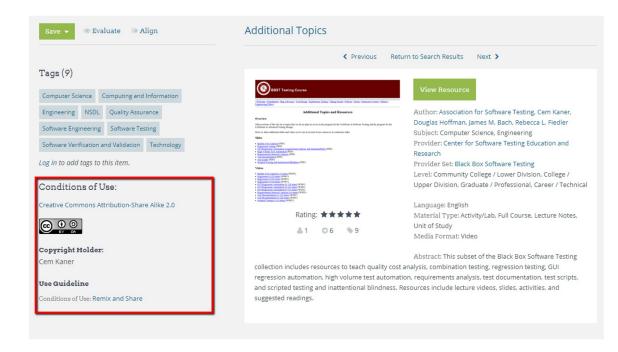

If you can't find the license information within the resource, look for the words:

- Copyright
- Licensing
- Terms of Use
- Conditions
