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Something to Say: Writing for Publication

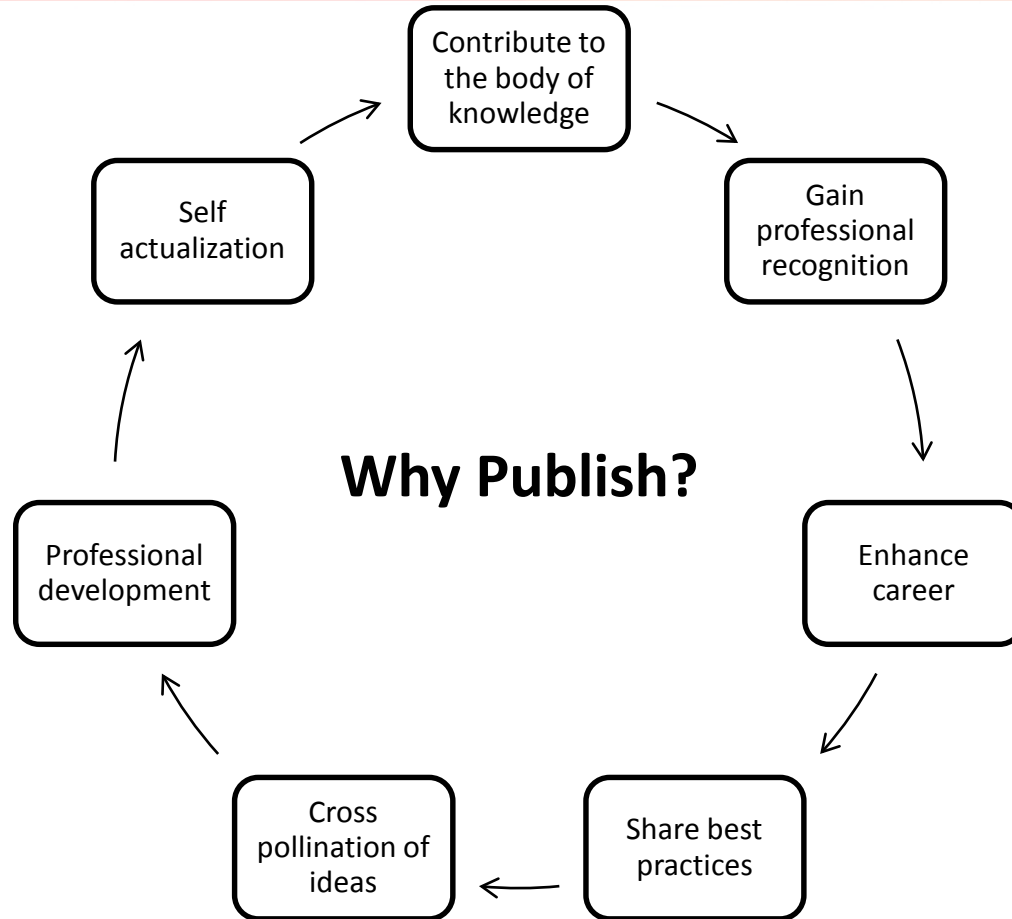
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■ Abstract

This interactive session recognizes the need to nurture and support new writers. It is designed to cultivate a spirit of inquiry in new writers, to promote individual manuscript writing development, and to build a community of support for them as they write

A guided conversation format with key questions will be used to engage participants in interactions about publishing; e.g. “what are your publishing goals?” “who might help you review your manuscript?” Specific tools e.g. a personal support circle schematic will also be used with participants to support self-reflection into their personal writing and publishing support.

 - Encourage a community of practice
